- Donation of furniture for the school boarding house and administration including booths, loose furniture and workstations

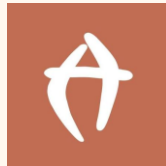

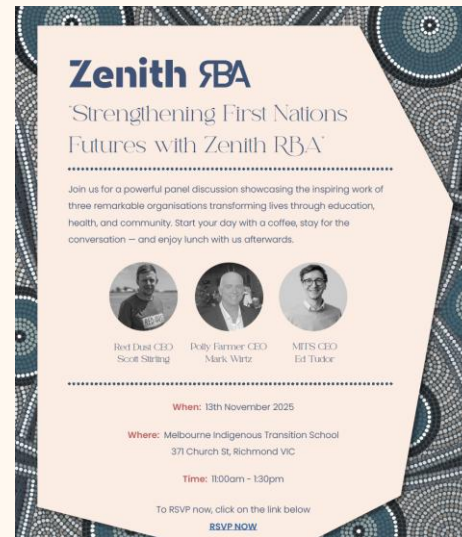
